The Project "Creative photo opportunities for youth employment"

Period of realization:

From 15st to 23rd May, 2013

Location:

Sutomore, Montenegro

The main goal of our training course "**Creative photo opportunities for youth employment**" is to offer to participants new creative techniques and learning methods for improving youth employment and inclusion of excluded groups of long term unemployed youth. Also by promotion youth participation and creative activities, as a result of our TC participants will use those learning methods in everyday work for their empowering and their youth employment.

Idea is to show that there is possibility to solve certain problem of a long term unemployed youth, by using creative opportunities and innovative methods of non formal learning and working on their empowering skills and knowledge. These creative methods can lead to solution or point out a problem that can be resolved by working on it afterwards.

Activities on our training course: presentation of Youth in Action Programme and informing long term unemployed youth about new possibilities, non-formal education and informal way of learning, ice-breakers, team building exercises, individual and group activities, work on practical examples in a small groups, discussions, debates, presentations, project proposal witting, thematic art workshops, making creative actions, creative initiatives, creative energizers, art and creative games, creating video, photos, drawings, paintings, work on individual and group activities.

Target group on our training course are people actively involved in work with unemployed young people (youth workers, youth leaders, play workers, NGO activists, school teachers, social workers, volunteers).

Objectives:

• to promote youth employment and inclusion as a most significant value working with youth that are long term unemployed.

• to increase awareness of the value and importance of creative participation as a form of active engagement and as a tool to develop and improve competences for personal, social and professional development.

• to encourage excluded young people with fewer opportunities – long term unemployed to play an active role in their communities.

• to contribute participants development of creative capabilities and skills using non formal learning and creative methods.

• to promote Youth in Action Programme, as an opportunity for active social participation of long term unemployed youth.







Working language:

English – all participants must be able to actively communicate using English language

Partners: 18 countries

Funding:

100% for accommodation and food will be covered, 70% of travel cost (Apex tickets) will be reimbursed after receiving original receipts and 100% visa costs.

Location

HOW TO REACH SUTOMORE

Meeting point:

Meeting point will be in Hotel "Galija" which is in center of Sutomore, address: coast lva Novakovica. Please note that we expect you to arrive on MAY 15th.

How to get to Sutomore

You can reach Sutomore directly from Podgorica (train, bus), Tivat (bus), Belgrade (train, bus), Split (bus) and Dubrovnik (bus). We are kindly asking you to choose the ecologically and economically friendly means of transport, if possible. If you choose airplane, please be aware that there are (unfortunately!) no cheap flights to Montenegro, but that you can find a cheap flight to Dubrovnik, Split, Belgrade or Ljubljana. Please take a look in table (down) about your maximum travel costs which we can refund.

From Podgorica (capital city of Montenegro) to Sutomore you can choose to take either train or bus.

Trains are cheaper and costs about 2 EUR one-way.

Buses from Podgorica to Sutomore go quite often. The price goes from 3 to 5 EUR.

From Tivat (Montenegro) to Sutomore you can get there by bus which go quite often. The price goes from 5 to 7 EUR.

From Belgrade (capital city of Serbia) to Sutomore you can choose to take either train or bus.







Trains are cheaper and costs about 25 EUR one way and less reliable (can be late between 1 and 2 hours!). The train ride usually takes a bit less than 10 hours.

Buses from Belgrade to Sutomore go quite often. The price goes from 25 to 30 EUR.

From Split (Croatia), to Sutomore you can get there by bus. The bus runs Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays at 16h. Ticket costs around 30 EUR.

From Dubrovnik (Croatia), to Sutomore you can get there by bus. The bus runs Mondays, Wednesdays and Saturdays at 16h. Ticket costs around 20 EUR.

Web site of Bus station in Podgorica is <u>http://www.busterminal.me/home</u> and Train station in Podgorica is <u>http://www.zcg-prevoz.me</u>. There are buses and trains from Podgorica to Sutomore every one-two hours between 5am and 11pm.

If you arrive to **Podgorica by plane**, taxi is the only transportation from the **Airport Podgorica («Golubovci»)** to bus and train stations in Podgorica. Taxi will take you to the central train station in Podgorica (ZELJEZNICKA STANICA), which is just next to the central bus station in Podgorica (AUTOBUSKA STANICA). The ride costs up to 5 - 6 EUR. Traveling by taxi can not be refunded but only in this case, if you ask taxi driver for a bill, we can refund.

If you arrive to **Tivat by plane**, taxi is the only transportation from the **Airport Tivat** to bus stations (AUTOBUSKA STANICA) in Tivat. The ride costs up to 5 - 6 EUR. **Traveling by taxi can not be refunded but only in this case, if you ask taxi driver for a bill, we can refund**.

How to get to Hotel "Galija"

Main train and bus station in Suromore are at the same place. From there to the Hotel you can walk, the hotel is distant about 500 meters. You can also take taxi but we can not refund taxi bills. Taxi for that route costs up to 2 - 5 EUR.

What to prepare:

- Bank account in EUR (details are in Application form)

USEFULL INFO

Language:

Montenegrin (Crnogorski jezik, Црногорски језик) is an incipient standardized register of the Serbo-Croatian language as spoken by Montenegrins used as the official language of Montenegro. The same subdialect of Shtokavian is also the basis of standard Bosnian, Croatian and Serbian, so all are mutually intelligible and are a single language by that criterion despite being distinct national standards.

Money

The domestic currency is the Euro.

You can exchange foreign currency in exchange offices and banks. Be aware that it might be difficult to exchange coins here, so bring the paper bills. There is no significant difference in the exchange rates, except at the airport, hotels and sometimes restaurants.

Many of the banks in Montenegro have ATMs. Visa, Master card and other cards can be used, but always ask in advance if you plan to pay something with it.

Customs

You are allowed to bring the following into Montenegro without facing taxes: 200 cigarettes, 50 cigars or 250 grams of tobacco; 1 liter of wine and 1 liter of spirits; 1/4 liter of Eau de Cologne and a 'reasonable' quantity of perfume; 2 photo cameras; 1 movie camera; 1 pair of binoculars; 1 pocket electronic calculator; camping equipment and 1 bicycle.

Foreigners are allowed to bring their medications, but are advised to declare the quantity on the entry to Serbia, so they won't have any problems leaving the country with it.

The venue

Sutomore

Sutomore (Serbian Cyrillic: Сутоморе; Venetian: Spizza) is a small coastal town in Bar Municipality, Montenegro.

Sutomore is tourism oriented community. It is a popular budget destination and a weekend resort, catering to tourists from Montenegro and the surrounding region. It is popular for its 2 km long sandy beach and vibrant nightlife.



Sutomore is located on the Adriatic Highway (E65/E80), and is connected to Podgorica and inland Montenegro via Sozina tunnel. It is also a stop on the Belgrade - Bar railway. The ease of access, coupled with its beach, has made Sutomore very popular budget destination. Sutomore is especially popular with the younger crowd from Serbia and rest of Montenegro, as its beach promenade is lined with numerous bars, cafes, restaurants and nightclubs, while it is more affordable than the 'upscale' resort of Budva..

Travel costs

We will reimburse **70% of the travel costs as listed below** for the TC on the basis of the cheapest possibilities, e.g. second class railway tickets, bus, flights etc. **by bank transfer after the TC** after we receive by post all **ORIGINAL tickets, bills, invoices, receipts, boarding tags/cards** etc. which you used.

We can not refund any travel costs done by car. If public transport is not possible, please contact us immediately as we need to check with European Commission from Brussels if they accept traveling by car, but we would need to justify the reasons why public transport is impossible before start of TC. Participant must travel from country of sending organization, and back. Following the guidelines of the YiA programme the travel back must be realized by the participants on direct way within maximum 4 days. In case of longer stays or indirect traveling (holiday travel etc.) there is no chance of reimbursement of travel costs. Missing tickets will not be reimbursed.

Visa expenses will be refunded 100%.
